Preparing for College





- Preparing for college may require scholars to:
 - Write essays
 - Obtain letters of recommendation
- Both essays and letters of recommendation can:
 - Provide more insight into who you are
 - Showcase yourself and differentiate you from others
 - Be an important decision factors for selection/award



Writing Essays General Guidance

- Draft essays early and prepare to revise multiple times.
- ❖ Find trusted individuals to proofread and critique your writing (teacher?).
- ❖ Use free online proofreading resources (i.e. Grammarly).
- Follow directions:
 - Type it/handwrite.
 - Max/min word count.
 - Adhere to submission deadlines.
 - * Address the specific essay topic or question.
- Write on various topics and save them all.
- ❖ Save and re-use content for multiple applications.



Writing Essays



- Be yourself and share about a personal experience.
- Reflect on who you are: strengths, talents, interests.
- Demonstrate knowledge of college/entity (facts/statistics).
- Share how you will make a difference.
- Ask for help (get a mentor).
- Brainstorm to generate ideas and be creative.
 - Can save you time.
 - Write down every idea/thought.
 - Highlight useful ideas that support the essay topic.

Writing Essays Sections of an Essay

- Develop a brief outline to organize your thoughts into manageable sections.
 - Introduction
 - Body
 - Conclusion
 - Introduction paragraph should:
 - Include a compelling hook (Interesting Question, Strong Statement/Declaration, Fact/Statistic, Metaphor, Story, Description, Quotation)
 - Grab and keep the reader's attention.
 - Contain a thesis statement with <u>three supporting points</u> you want to make in the essay.
 - Answer the essay question/topic through these three supporting points.

Writing Essays Sections of an Essay

Body paragraphs should:

- Develop a paragraph for each of the three supporting points.
- Paragraph 1: Start with your *strongest* supporting point.
- Includes facts and other supporting details that expand on major themes.
- Share personal reflections in each paragraph.

Conclusion paragraph should:


- Restate your compelling hook and thesis statement.
- Concisely summarize each of the three supporting points.
- Share any important information.
- Leave the reader with a lasting thought related to the essay theme.

Writing Essays Essay Themes

- You may pick a topic or instructed to write on a particular topic.
- **T**en common essay themes include (*what are some other themes?*):

Career/Major	Contribution
Challenges	Creativity
Change	Financial need
Character	Leadership
Community Service	Personal Statement

Writing Essays (Conclusion)



- Don't be afraid to apply for scholarships with essays!
- You won't fear essay writing when you are prepared.
- Essays offer you OPPORTUNITY to shine.
- When the competition is close, what will be the difference maker?

Getting Letters of Recommendation General Guidance

- Request letters of recommendation for:
 - College applications
 - Scholarship applications
- Who should you ask for letters?
 - Teachers (establish a rapport during the school year)
 - School Counselors
 - Coaches
 - Employers
 - Community Leaders
- Tailor your ask for the type of college/scholarship application.
- Request multiple copies and ask for generic letters that can be reused.
- Make a list of recommenders that you trust and who will provide a positive reference but keep an ongoing list.



Getting Letters of Recommendation General Guidance

- Provide recommenders with submission instructions.
 - Mail (provide stamped envelope)
 - Send electronically
 - Both



- Set recommenders deadlines 1-2 weeks before your deadline.
- Follow-up to make sure letters are received by the deadline.
- Offer a pre-drafted letter of recommendation for them to tailor.
- Save and re-use content for multiple applications.
- Provide a Scholar Profile with your recommendation request.

Use Your Time Wisely Timeline (11-12th Grade)

- ☐ Narrow down college majors or fields of study
- ☐ Research college requirements (essay or letters of recommendation?)
- ☐ Build your Scholar Profile
- Stay involved in activities (sports, clubs, community)
- ☐ Identify who can write letters of recommendations
- ☐ Research and **apply** for scholarships

Use Your Time Wisely Timeline (12th Grade)

- ☐ Select a college major or field of study
- ☐ Select and apply to your top colleges
- ☐ Write essays
- ☐ Obtain letters of recommendation
- ☐ Update your Scholar Profile
- ☐ Apply for scholarships and track results



Summary

- **Start early:**
 - Writing essays
 - ❖ Identifying who can write letters of recommendation.
- ❖ Do your college and scholarship research to understand requirements.
- ❖ Develop a Scholar Profile and differentiate yourself.
- Highlight your plans to make a different or contribute to society.
- Don't waste people's time (be responsive).
- Create a file for your documents and save your essays.
- Say thank you to those who help you.

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
