

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

I have been reflecting about the Gospel of this Sunday – what is the greatest commandment. I want first to clarify a few words. In Hebrew, the original language of the Old Testament, the word “commandment” does not appear when God speaks to the people about the Covenant. God refers as “debarim” or WORDS. For this reason, God gave the people of Israel 10 WORDS of life, an essential guide of how to be happy and fulfilled in this life. So, when the Pharisees go to test Jesus and ask what the greatest commandment is, they miss completely the point. They have transformed the Covenant of God and the people to a set of rules and regulations that need to be followed and fulfilled in order to be ok in front of God. What God said in the Covenant was that He wanted the people to be free and fulfill their call to holiness and happiness. When can fall into this predicament, we transform our relationship with God to just rules and regulations. Jesus says that the greatest commandment is to Love God above all and our neighbor as ourselves. Therefore, if I want to reach fullness of Joy and content, I need to love God and neighbor, and if I discover that I can't then I need to ask to the one who can give me this gift. We cannot be content and happy until we rest in God as St. Augustine said. We are working to repair the Lennon Hall ASAP, please keep praying that it is resolved soon. Also, next two week we are going to have a special collection for Building Maintenance, please be generous in the upkeep of our house. And if you can please help us by opening an account in TD Bank or say that you are our parishioner to the bank if you already have an account there – Please see the bulletin for details. POPE FRANCIS GENERAL AUDIENCE

Wednesday, 21 October 2020

Where there is God, the human person must be there as well. Sacred Scripture is categorical: "We love, because he first loved us". He always goes ahead of us. He always awaits us because He loves us first, He looks at us first, He understands us first. He always awaits us. "If any one says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen". If you pray many rosaries each day but then gossip about others, and nourish grudges inside, if you hate others, this is truly artificial, it is not true. "And this commandment we have from him, that he who loves God should love his brother also" (*1 Jn 4:19-21*). Scripture acknowledges the case of the person who, even though he or she sincerely searches for God, never succeeds to encounter Him; but it also affirms that the tears of the poor can never be repudiated on pain of not encountering God. God does not support the "atheism" of those who repudiate the divine image that is imprinted in every human being. That everyday atheism: I believe in God but I keep my distance from others and I allow myself to hate others. This is practical atheism. Not to recognize the human person as the image of God is a sacrilege, an abomination, the worst offense that can be directed toward the temple and the altar. Dear brothers and sisters, the prayers of the Psalms help us not to fall into the temptation of the "wicked", that is, of living, and perhaps also of praying, as if God does not exist, and as if the poor do not exist.

Donde está Dios, también debe estar el hombre. La Sagrada Escritura es categórica: «Nosotros amemos, porque él nos amó primero» (*1Jn 4, 19*). El siempre va antes que nosotros. El nos espera siempre porque nos ama primero, nos mira primero, nos entiende primero. El nos espera siempre. «Si alguno dice "Amo a Dios", y aborrece a su hermano, es un mentiroso; pues quien no ama a su hermano, a quien ve, no puede amar a Dios a quien no ve» (*1Jn 4, 20*). Si tú rezas muchos rosarios al día pero luego chismorreas sobre los otros, y después tienes rancor dentro, tienes odio contra los otros, esto es puro artificio, no es verdad. «Y hemos recibido de él este mandamiento: quien ama a Dios, ame también a su hermano» (*1Jn 4, 21*). La Escritura admite el caso de una persona que, incluso buscando sinceramente a Dios, nunca logra encontrarlo; pero afirma también que las lágrimas de los pobres no se pueden negar nunca, so pena de no encontrar a Dios. Dios no sostiene el "ateísmo" de quien niega la imagen divina que está impresa en todo ser humano. Ese ateísmo de todos los días: yo creo en Dios pero con los otros mantengo la distancia y me permito odiar a los otros. Esto es el ateísmo práctico. No reconocer la persona humana como imagen de Dios es un sacrilegio, es una abominación, es la peor ofensa que se puede llevar al templo y al altar. Queridos hermanos y hermanas, que la oración de los salmos nos ayude a no caer en la tentación de la "impiedad", es decir de vivir, y quizás también de rezar, como si Dios no existiera, y como si los pobres no existieran.

Onde está Deus, deve estar também o homem. A Sagrada Escritura é categórica: «Mas amamos, porque Deus nos amou primeiro - Ele está sempre à nossa frente. Ele espera sempre por nós porque nos ama primeiro, ele olha para nós primeiro, ele comprehende-nos primeiro. Ele espera sempre por nós - Se alguém disser: "Amo a Deus", mas odeia o seu irmão, é mentiroso. Porque aquele que não ama o seu irmão, a quem vê, é incapaz de amar a Deus, a quem não vê. - Se rezas muitos terços por dia mas depois falas mal de outros, e depois sentes rancor interior, ódio contra o próximo, isto é puro artifício, não é verdadeiro. - De Deus recebemos este mandamento: aquele que amar a Deus, ame também ao seu irmão» (*1 Jo 4, 19-21*). A Escritura admite o caso de uma pessoa que, mesmo procurando sinceramente a Deus, nunca consegue encontrá-lo; mas afirma também que nunca se pode negar as lágrimas dos pobres, sob pena de não encontrar a Deus. Deus não suporta o "ateísmo" daqueles que negam a imagem divina impressa em cada ser humano. Aquele ateísmo quotidiano: acredito em Deus, mas com os outros mantenho a minha distância e permito-me odiar os outros. Isto é ateísmo prático. Deixar de reconhecer a pessoa humana como imagem de Deus é um sacrilégio, uma abominação, é a pior ofensa que se pode levar ao templo e ao altar. Estimados irmãos e irmãs, que a oração dos Salmos nos ajude a não cair na tentação da "impiedade", ou seja, de viver, e talvez até de rezar como se Deus não existisse, como se os pobres não existissem.
