Fall is Here!

- If winter were a problem last year, apply a pre-emergence herbicide to the lawn in early October. Be sure the herbicide is safe for the type of grass in your lawn.
- Watch for brown patch fungus disease in lawns.
- Watch for chinch bug damage in St. Augustine lawns, if the weather stays hot.
- Lawns may be over-seeded with rye grass for a green lawn during the winter.
- · Watch for sod webworms and army worm damage to lawns.
- Begin planting strawberries in mid to late October in Northeast Florida, they grow through the winter.
- Vegetables to plant now: Beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, Chinese cabbage, collards, kohirabi, bulbing onions, bunching onions, radishes, spinach and turnips.
- Annuals to plant now: Digitalis, lobelia, pansies, petunias, shasta daisies. Happy Gardeníng!

The library renovation is complete with new flooring, area carpet, new lighting and book shelves. New table, chairs and presentation screen add business meeting capabilities to the room. Outside landscaping under the direction of a landscape architect is in (continued on page 4)

full swing with the extensive beds of flowers and shrubs being added around the building and pool.

The Board has approved replacement of the large jalousie windows in the ballroom to complete the window replacement part of the renovation.

In the next three months curbing in the parking lot will be replaced where broken and painted. The pool will be drained and the surface marcite will be recoated. The Board has engaged an engineering firm to supervise the marcite surfacing and to develop specifications to convert the old chlorinating system to a modern salt water system which is expected to save on operating costs. The pool bathrooms are to be totally renovated to ADA standards once the pool closes for the season. This work is being designed and supervised under the direction of an architect.

Renovation of the office area will complete the major components of the renovation with painting and carpeting and office dividers to add flexibility to the work area.

In other business areas the Board is gaining more capability for handling and tracking deed restrictions using the reinstated County system. The cooperation with County Code Enforcement has improved in recent weeks.

The Board is continuing to research the idea of having a memorial brick area dedicated in the Riverview Facility area. As details develop, the Board plans to pass on the ideas to homeowners.
