The Triumphal Entry

Luke 19: ^{Lk 19:35} They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. ^{Lk 19:36} As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road. ^{Lk 19:37} When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:

^{Lk 19:38} "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

^{Lk 19:39} Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"

Lk 19:40 "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."

^{Lk 19:41} As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it ^{Lk 19:42} and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes. ^{Lk 19:43} The days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you and encircle you and hem you in on every side. ^{Lk} ^{19:44} They will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you."

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The Fickle Crowd

Luke ^{Lk 23:13} Pilate called together the chief priests, the rulers and the people, ^{Lk 23:14} and said to them, "You brought me this man as one who was inciting the people to rebellion. I have examined him in your presence and have found no basis for your charges against him. ^{Lk 23:15} Neither has Herod, for he sent him back to us; as you can see, he has done nothing to deserve death. ^{Lk 23:16} Therefore, I will punish him and then release him."

^{Lk 23:18} With one voice they cried out, "Away with this man! Release Barabbas to us!" ^{Lk} ^{23:19} (Barabbas had been thrown into prison for an insurrection in the city, and for murder.) ^{Lk 23:20} Wanting to release Jesus, Pilate appealed to them again. ^{Lk 23:21} But they kept shouting, "Crucify him! Crucify him!"

^{Lk 23:22} For the third time he spoke to them: "Why? What crime has this man committed? I have found in him no grounds for the death penalty. Therefore I will have him punished and then release him."

^{Lk 23:23} But with loud shouts they insistently demanded that he be crucified, and their shouts prevailed. ^{Lk 23:24} So Pilate decided to grant their demand. ^{Lk 23:25} He released the man who had been thrown into prison for insurrection and murder, the one they asked for, and surrendered Jesus to their will.

Ezekiel 34: Shepherds and Sheep

^{Eze 34:1} The word of the LORD came to me:

^{Eze 34:2} "Son of man, prophesy against the shepherds of Israel; prophesy and say to them: 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: Woe to the shepherds of Israel who only take care of themselves! Should not shepherds take care of the flock?

^{Eze 34:3} You eat the curds, clothe yourselves with the wool and slaughter the choice animals, but you do not take care of the flock. ^{Eze 34:4} You have not strengthened the weak or healed the sick or bound up the injured. You have not brought back the strays or searched for the lost. You have ruled them harshly and brutally. ^{Eze 34:5} So they were scattered because there was no shepherd, and when they were scattered they became food for all the wild animals. ^{Eze 34:6} My sheep wandered over all the mountains and on every high hill. They were scattered over the whole earth, and no one searched or looked for them. ^{Eze 34:7} " 'Therefore, you shepherds, hear the word of the LORD?

^{Eze 34:8} As surely as I live, declares the Sovereign LORD, because my flock lacks a shepherd and so has been plundered and has become food for all the wild animals, and because my shepherds did not search for my flock but cared for themselves rather than for my flock, ^{Eze 34:9} therefore, O shepherds, hear the word of the LORD?

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^{Eze 34:10} This is what the Sovereign LORD says: I am against the shepherds and will hold them accountable for my flock. I will remove them from tending the flock so that the shepherds can no longer feed themselves. I will rescue my flock from their mouths, and it will no longer be food for them. ^{Eze 34:11} " For this is what the Sovereign LORD says: I myself will search for my sheep and look after them. ^{Eze 34:12} As a shepherd looks after his scattered flock when he is with them, so will I look after my sheep. I will rescue them from all the places where they were scattered on a day of clouds and darkness. ^{Eze 34:13} I will bring them out from the nations and gather them from the countries, and I will bring them into their own land. I will pasture them on the mountains of Israel, in the ravines and in all the settlements in the land. ^{Eze 34:14} I will tend them in a good pasture, and the mountain heights of Israel will be their grazing land. There they will lie down in good grazing land, and there they will feed in a rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. ^{Eze 34:16} I will search for the lost and bring back the strays. I will bind up the injured and strengthen the weak, but the sleek and the strong I will destroy. I will shepherd the flock with justice.

^{Eze 34:17} " 'As for you, my flock, this is what the Sovereign LORD says: I will judge between one sheep and another, and between rams and goats. ^{Eze 34:18} Is it not enough for you to feed on the good pasture? Must you also trample the rest of your pasture with your feet? Is it not enough for you to drink clear water? Must you also muddy the rest with your feet?

^{Eze 34:19} Must my flock feed on what you have trampled and drink what you have muddied with your feet?

^{Eze 34:20} " 'Therefore this is what the Sovereign LORD says to them: See, I myself will judge between the fat sheep and the lean sheep. ^{Eze 34:21} Because you shove with flank and shoulder, butting all the weak sheep with your horns until you have driven them away, ^{Eze 34:22} I will save my flock, and they will no longer be plundered. I will judge between one sheep and another. ^{Eze 34:23} I will place over them one shepherd, my servant David, and he will tend them; he will tend them and be their shepherd. ^{Eze 34:24} I the LORD will be their God, and my servant David will be prince among them. I the LORD have spoken.

^{Eze 34:25} " 'I will make a covenant of peace with them and rid the land of wild beasts so that they may live in the desert and sleep in the forests in safety. ^{Eze 34:26} I will bless them and the places surrounding my hill. I will send down showers in season; there will be showers of blessing. ^{Eze 34:27} The trees of the field will yield their fruit and the ground will yield its crops; the people will be secure in their land. They will know that I am the LORD, when I break the bars of their yoke and rescue them from the hands of those who enslaved them. ^{Eze 34:28} They will no longer be plundered by the nations, nor will wild animals devour them. They will live in safety, and no one will make them afraid. ^{Eze ^{34:29} I will provide for them a land renowned for its crops, and they will no longer be victims of famine in the land or bear the scorn of the nations. ^{Eze 34:30} Then they will}

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know that I, the LORD their God, am with them and that they, the house of Israel, are my people, declares the Sovereign LORD.

^{Eze 34:31} You my sheep, the sheep of my pasture, are people, and I am your God, declares the Sovereign LORD.' "

There is an idea in Liberal Theology called 'The Social Gospel' that in its 'purest' form is a form of unbelief, wherein it claims that Jesus was simply a social reformer. This is not true; He was and is The Eternal Son of The Living God. But it is also true that God does speak into political situations and against injustice and in favor or mercy. In today's sermon, who was right, the shepherds or the sheep? Neither we are all born sinful and we need Jesus to save us and give us new hearts.

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VI. If you mean it (and I don't mean that you feel that you have the will or power to live a perfect life, but if you *want* to, because you want to love Jesus and be forgiven and so on...)

Or you can simply cry out, meaning all of the above, 'Lord Jesus, please save me!' And pray however God leads your heart... But remember, our hearts are wicked, we don't follow our hearts, we follow God as revealed in His Bible and through His Spirit.
