AREA REPRESENTATIVE REPORT – KATHY DRAKE, WAIKATO UPPER NORTH ISLAND

The hot topic up here again is WEATHER! We had a dry start to summer, but it has more than made up for that in the last five weeks with over 650mls of rain falling which is half our normal YEARLY rainfall. It started on the 8th March with 133mls falling in a 24 hour period. The last four weeks have delivered us significant weather bombs one after the other and we have had flooding in our back paddock which outstrips anything we have seen in the 28 years we have been living here. Thank goodness we managed to dodge the worst of Cyclone Cook with only a top up of rain that tipped some of our already soggy paddocks over the edge! but it could have been a lot worse. Fortunately it is only our back paddock with a wee creek running through it that is at risk of extreme flooding. At least the stock are all high and dry on the top part of the property, which does get soggy but not inundated like some areas of the North Island have been.

The Shetlands have access to a huge covered yard with plywood walls up to the top of the post and rails, so they can really hunker down out of the weather. Likewise the two old (32yo and 34yo) retired RDA ponies have a similar covered yard in their paddock which they can access to get out of the weather. They spent most of the heat of the summer in under cover, but the first day of rain they could be seen leaping around like youngsters—but I think the novelty has now well and truly worn off. The shetlands take anything in their stride and rain, hail or shine they just have their heads down eating!! Hence they tend to have restricted sessions on the grass morning and evening and the rest of the time they spend in either the round pen or their yard getting topped up with plenty of hay to negate the effects of the lush pasture we tend to grow in this area. It has been nice to see Canterbury getting much needed moisture though, although I suspect at some stage enough will be enough even there!

Ann and Tiffany Storms took Northclose McDhui and Burravoe Randolph to the Franklin A&P Show in February—their first show for four years. 26 year old McDhui was obviously enjoying his outing—resplendent in his Cushing's induced fluffy coat he still placed 3rd in the Paced and Mannered, 3rd in Handy Pony and won the Tip and Out jumping, showing the youngsters how it should be done —there's still plenty of life in the old boy! Randolph had his first show outing in the North Island and was very well behaved for Tiffany and they went home with ribbons also.

There are two more Canterbury Shetlands resident in the Auckland area now with Jeffrey Jones' purchase of Cotswold Canasta and Birchlands Spotlight off Muriel Cromie of Waimate. Even though they had to take the long route up, with the Kaikoura coast road closed, they arrived safely and settled in happily. Rod and I popped up to South Head on the Kaipara Harbour coast to meet Jeff and his Shetlands. Both are looking in good health and have a fantastic paddock with their own purpose built shelter and a grove of trees and the company of Jeff's miniature horse and a hand raised deer. They are obviously very much loved and want for nothing. Jeff wasn't home when we first arrived so we took the liberty of going into the paddock to talk to the shetties. Both ponies (plus the mini) came running up the paddock to greet us, but Cotswold Canasta wasn't going to let us touch her until Jeff arrived, when she suddenly became very friendly. One smart wee pony who, although she has only been with Jeff for a short time, already has trust in his judgement!! We had a lovely tour of the Kaipara area while we were there—love where these Shetlands take us to!!!

Great reports coming back re Cotswold Merrilees. Jacqueline Longmore-Procter has lent her to a family in North Auckland for a wee 4yo girl. She has been going to Pony Club and participated in the Pony Club camp in January with great success. Another wee rider getting a good start courtesy of a Shetland pony. I also believe there is another sibling in that family, so I think Merri may have a long term home there.

Chelsea Fuller from Whitinui stud has also recently sold two of her homebred fillies within the Auckland area, leaving her with one mare and her young stallion, who may yet end up being gelded if there is no interest in breeding with him.

Another local Shetland is Lael Valor who was purchased by Annette Green as a 'small pony' from the far North of New Zealand (its amazing how far some Shetlands have travelled), and it wasn't until his vaccination certificate arrived for him 2 months later that she realised he was in fact a purebred Shetland. I certainly don't need to explain to the enthusiasts among us that it didn't take long for the Shetland charm to surface, and she is now very much smitten with the breed. She has had him out at her local A&P show and a pony club show and also has been working with him in harness.

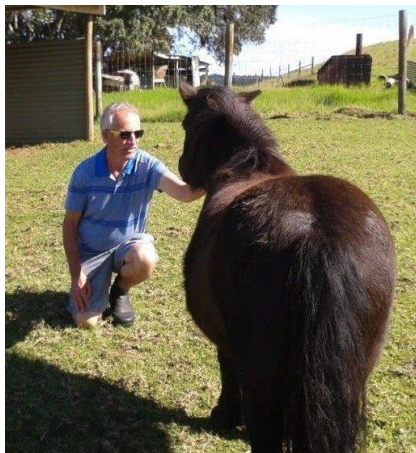

Junior Handler Award (Formerly Young Exhibitor)

This award is open to any Junior Handler aged 5–18 years (age as at and including 15th May 2017) exhibiting a Shetland pony registered in the NZSPBS Stud Book. **Participants do not need to be members of the NZSPBS.** All in-hand shows held during the show season from 1st October 2016 to 15th May 2017 with Shetland classes (e.g. A&P, Breeders, NZSPBS, and Regional Shows etc.) are eligible.

The classes eligible for the award are, Breed and Conformation classes, Best Presented or Turnout, Best Paced and Best Mannered.

A trophy is awarded to the Junior Handler with the most points throughout the show season, however if the recipient or their family is not a financial member of the NZSPBS, the Society shall retain the trophy. 1st to 6th place-getters shall receive a sash and certificate.

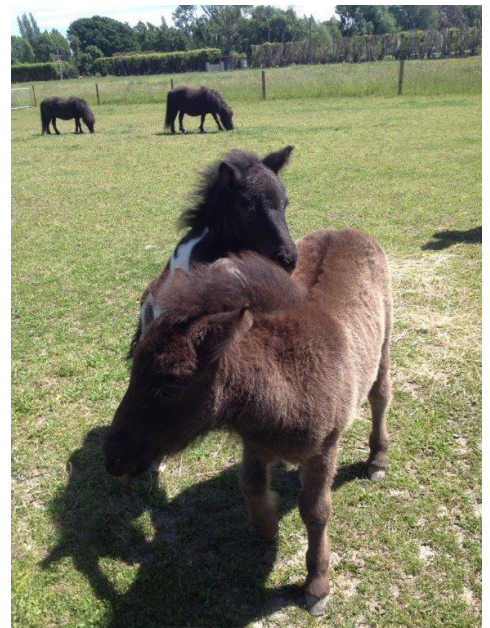

STUD PROFILE – KAIWOOD STUD

What is the name of your stud, how is it pronounced?	Kaiwood – pronounced as it is spelt.
How did you come up with your stud name?	We live halfway between Kaiapoi and Woodend and it's always been a contentious issue with our family and friends whether we are from Kaiapoi or Woodend. So we used a bit of both.
Where is your stud located?	In North Canterbury, halfway between Kaiapoi and Woodend on Fullers Road, which is towards the beach from the main road. We have 5 acres.
How many ponies do you have at your stud?	Just 5 – 1 gelding, 2 mares and 2 foals.
What is the name of your stallion(s)?	We do not have a stallion.
How many foals have been born or are due this season?	2 foals, both colts, Kaiwood Dark Knight (name pending), born 9 th October 2016 out of Birchlands Pollyanna by Duncree Eclipse and Kaiwood Little Rascal (name pending), born 4 th November 2016 out of Brocman Park Moonlight Mayhem by Duncree Eclipse.
Describe the aim of your stud.	To have healthy, well-mannered ponies, true to their type, and that are versatile in any discipline.
Do you have any advice for members interested in starting their own Stud?	When you have in-foal mares be prepared for sleepless nights on foal watch. Get advice from an experienced person, e.g. I've called on Catherine Crosado many a time for advice and she's been brilliant. Actually that's in respect of starting up a stud and just having Shetland's in general.
Describe your ponies in 10 words or less.	Fun, easy to look after and great little characters.

Foula was a fieldwork presence before I ever set foot on the island. Stories of "the edge of the world": Of high cliffs, hostile seas and teeming seabird cities. Looking across from the west side of Shetland my attention, and imagination was drawn to its mist shrouded hills, at times tantalisingly close, on other days made invisible by weather.

But it was the ponies that really drew me to Foula. Tales of Shetland ponies living as they had for centuries, out on the open hill. At 20 miles from mainland Shetland and with a population below thirty, Foula is often depicted as one of the wildest and most remote areas of the UK. In June 2015 I gazed out the window of the eight seater plane, excitement rising as we came in to land. As the plane bounced to a halt, the area around the air strip was a hive of activity. Boxes were loaded on the plane and farewells said to the small group of passengers boarding. A fire engine, present for the landing, moved away to park up until tomorrow's flight. Several people warily eyed flock of meandering sheep, ready to shoo them if they strayed onto the runway. As I walked along the island's only road in search of ponies, I was struck by the sheer presence of the hills that give Foula its distinctive shape. Although mainland Shetland has areas of cliff and hill, there is nothing to compare to these steep, jagged peaks, silhouetted against the sky and visible from everywhere on the island. At the bottom of the hills, by the sea, the ground is alive with the pinks and yellows of wildflowers and the constant motion of bog cotton bobbing and rearing in the wind. The rasping call of fulmar and the cluck of bonxies mixed with a low howl from the wind and the distant baaing of sheep.

It is landscapes like this, of hill, sea and wind, where the Shetland pony has lived and evolved for thousands of years. These landscapes had a major influence on the ways domestication relationships unfolded in Shetland and continue to influence contemporary practice.

As I approached the cottage where one of the pony breeders lived I was surprised by how few ponies I could see. A piebald stallion pranced, watchful, his mane whipped by the wind. In the next field a grey mare and foal stood, ears pricked, while a small brown pony approached the gate. "Most of my ponies are out there" Sheila told me gesturing towards the hill behind us. As she introduced the horses she commented on what a good mother the gray mare is before stating that she expects this to be her last foal before she joins the pensioners. Intrigued, I asked who these pensioners are.

Sheila described how by watching ponies on the hill, over time you start to notice certain continuities in behaviour. You see which ponies like to spend time with each other and how they behave differently towards their friends. Older mares, even from different herds, will often start to spend time together. In the past these groups of mares would often successfully avoid the stallion, choosing not to allow themselves to get in foal. Even now that there is no stallion on the hill the "OAPs" still form their own group. Often you can predict if there is likely to be bad weather coming based on where on the hill the horses have chosen to shelter. In summer, when you see them running, prancing, shaking their tails and heading to the highest parts of the hill then you know it is a good day to caa the sheep. The ponies are moving to get out of the way of dense midge clouds which also bother the sheep. This means the flock is likely to be happy be herded down towards the croft where the wind coming in off the sea is likely to disperse the midges somewhat.

Although Sheila does not go out every day with the specific purpose of visiting the hill ponies, as she goes about her everyday tasks like bird counts, leading guided walks and croft work, she pays attention to where the ponies are and what they are doing. If some days have passed and a particular pony has not been seen she will ask around to see if anybody else knows where they are. During my time in Foula I heard several conversations where people would update each other on where they had recently seen ponies. If none of her neighbours had seen the pony recently then she would go to the hill to look for them. Different ponies have their favourite places, and where they are most likely to be in depends a lot on the weather conditions, so she usually has a good idea where to look. In most cases the ponies will be found fairly quickly in the places they are expected to be. She said that the ponies are very well adapted to life out on the hill, it is the ideal environment for them. The only mares that are kept down by the croft are the younger ones who are being worked with and any that are older or ill.

I had met Penny and had quick chats several times as I walked along the island's main road. With a croft, family and several jobs she was always busy and it was not until later in the week that I managed to spend some time with her on the croft with her ponies. Two playful chestnut and white foals frolicked through the long grass as she introduced her ponies, giving a quick biography of each. On mainland Shetland, breeders will often have a time when they bring the pregnant mares to fields near to the croft when they think foaling time is drawing close. I asked Penny how they know the right time to bring them down when the ponies are far away in the hill, she said that she doesn't. It is the ponies who choose when to come down and they know the right time.

As foaling time approaches, mares come down to the croft where they know they will find extra feed and safe sheltered area to give birth. If foaling time was approaching and a mare had not been seen*, she would go into the hill to look for her and bring her down but in most cases the mares come themselves. Once the foals are born, Sheila and Penny spend a lot of time working with them. Though these practices, ponies become used to contact and learn to associate the croft with food, care and safety.

While living up on the hill, ponies will often choose to return to the croft: to visit members of their herd that are kept in,** to get a little extra feed or if they have fallen ill. Both breeders described trusting their animal's intelligence and instincts to know when to come to the croft.

The way these crofters in Foula work with their animals epitomizes the ideals of autonomy that many Shetland breeders would like their ponies to demonstrate. For most of their lives the ponies live independently on the hill. Their owners, trusting their intelligence and adaptability, allow them to thrive in their herds with minimal human intervention. Although at first glance this may seem like a very hands off form of animal husbandry, in practice it takes a lot of time and knowledge. It is not a case of just setting animals loose on the hill and expecting them to survive. Ponies early years are characterised by intensive human contact and both breeders I worked with said they would never put an animal out on the hill that they felt did not have the knowledge and skills to thrive out there. They need to trust that each pony has the sense to live as part of the hill herd but also that they consider the croft a safe place they can return to. Although breeders do not often go into the hill specifically to look for their ponies, as they go about daily life, they pay attention to the hill and the animals they see there. This attention extends from breeders to other members of the community. In this way, the health and location of ponies becomes part of the conversation and social life on this island.

*Also if any mare had not been seen or there was any concern for an animal on the hill both Sheila and Penny would go to look for them to ensure their wellbeing.

**Ponies may be kept in for various reasons such as old age, ill health, waiting for vet visit etc.

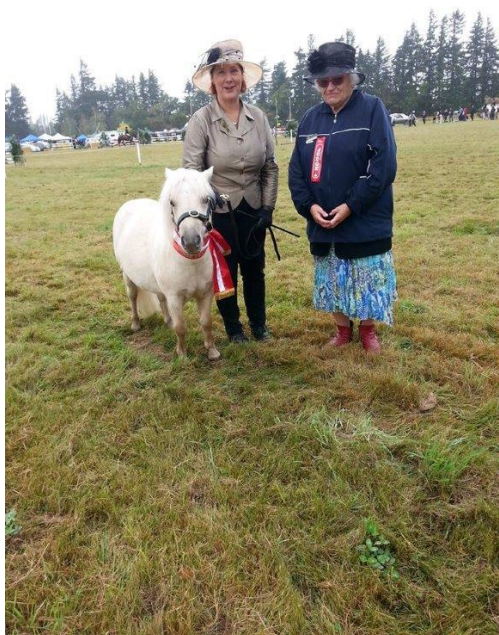
