





I'm sure many of our report authors started their report by stating the obvious - no one expected that covid was planning to stick around this long. Last year this report began by acknowledging the disruption of covid and how we immediately laid off three of our seven staff and redirected our remaining four in a multitude of new and unexpected ways. Over the past calendar year there have been changes to our staffing and certainly not entirely what we expected. Children's ministries officially resumed Sunday ministry again in September. With that expansion, we were grateful to have Molly Johnson agree to take the lead in the Jr. Youth classroom on Sunday mornings, and she has once again started assisting with the senior youth program on Friday nights as well. She's been incredibly busy as a substitute teacher for the public school system so with all factors considered, it worked better for the church and for her to operate on an honorarium basis as opposed to adding her to the regular payroll.

In early October, Pastor Ches and Kathy announced their plans to retire which were a surprise to many. There were many factors that were considered in their decision but this was thought to be as ideal of timing as there could be with so many programs currently on hold, and the shifting that had inevitably started to occur as online attendance grew and mandates made it more challenging to attend church in person. Almost three decades of ministry at Crossroads. What an incredible legacy they leave. We continue to be ever grateful for the way they have shepherded this church and our people and invested so much of themselves into their many forms of ministry. We bless them and thank them and pray that retirement allows them the freedom to minister in new ways. Many of you are relieved as you noticed that although Pastor Ches is no longer officially your pastor, he and Kathy

are a dedicated part of your church family. They have blessed us by continuing to participate in worship ministry, ladies bible study and children's church. Thank you to each member of our church family as we honestly weren't sure how to ensure there was a smooth separation of the roles. It seems we had little to worry about as any concerns have appropriately been directed to Marivic or the board to ensure they are communicated to the correct person. We appreciate each of you and your commitment to figuring this out together.

Crossroads became the eleventh of sixty PAOC churches in Saskatchewan to be entering a period of transition. To say there is a shortage of interim pastors in the province is an understatement. We've had our district superintendent, Rev. Paul Israelson, come and minister with his wife. The week he came we were also able to meet and interview a potential candidate for the interim position. He was incredibly qualified with a very unique skill set but we opted to continue the search. Shortly after we were blessed to have Rev. Doug Hope come share with our congregation. As December is a very busy month for most people, Rev. Hope and his lovely wife Cindy, were very patient as we invited him to continue returning each week before finally sitting down to work out an actual agreement at the beginning of January. Since officially accepting the position of interim pastor, Rev. Hope has been incredibly diligent in reviewing our website, and our most frequently used documents and making helpful suggestions. His sermons have received many positive comments each week and he's made himself readily available for anything we have requested of him thus far. We are grateful and so appreciative for his leadership through our transition.

Our church is so blessed to have a faithful servant like Henry Peters taking care of our building. And for far too long, doing it largely on his own. This winter in particular has demanded a lot of him as we've dealt with record breaking snow fall. He's incredibly gifted with a variety of skills that allow him to handle a wide variety of tasks in and around the building. Over the coming weeks, I'm challenging each of you to take a moment to personally tell Henry what a great job he does or write and leave him a note of encouragement.

Crossroads also has an incredible asset in our secretary Marivic. She's been with us for almost thirteen years now and there's just no limits to the things she will learn to improve life for those she serves. She's the creative genius behind any of the signage you see posted both in the church and online and handles an impressive amount of all the technology at the church. She keeps our website and social media up to date, handles the church library and prepares each week for the worship team and all the graphics that are displayed during the service each week. When covid began, Marivic spent weeks learning how to edit videos for any of the sermons that were recorded in advance, and played a very important role in helping to establish our live streaming. She is also an integral part of our ministry team. She is the first point of contact for anyone seeking pastoral care and often ministers to and prays with many members of our church family and perfect strangers over the phone. Please join me in thanking her for everything she does for our church.

Since I'm actually going to admit that it's me writing this report this year, I'm just going to share that I came on staff at Crossroads almost fifteen years ago as the church treasurer. When I began, most of our bookkeeping was still done by hand. I have been able to incorporate additional programs that have simplified tasks such as recording the donations and issuing tax receipts. Most tasks are done routinely throughout the week. Adding the extra electronic options for giving has made the bookkeeping a little more time intensive as I routinely use four separate programs that don't communicate with each other. However, the bright side to that is any errors made are usually discovered fairly quickly. I took over directing the children's ministries department over ten years ago. It honestly wasn't something I had considered pursuing previously but I am so grateful that what once started as me filling a need for the church has grown into something that I thoroughly enjoy. It was incredibly helpful to have my mother available to advise me with her many years of experience working with preschoolers. I have tried to ensure I spend a reasonable amount of time on personal development each year by taking classes online, reading books recommended by other children's pastors and attending any nearby conferences. I am always up to try anything at least once but a parent had once given me the best compliment ever in saying that her children enjoyed coming because they could tell that I sincerely loved them. Organization and planning ahead are weaknesses

of mine but I am so very grateful for the patience of each of the amazing volunteers who work with me in this very important mission field. Approximately five years ago, we were also in need of someone to take on youth ministries as well. At that point, many of the youth were kids I'd had the privilege of already developing relationships with as they moved through children's church and junior youth so the progression was very natural. It's a bit of a juggle to handle all three portfolios but I do greatly enjoy the variety.

Mary Campbell was laid off as our program co-ordinator when covid began but the board recently brought her on staff again to aid in the transition process in a variety of capabilities. This month, Mary has kept extra busy organizing a deep clean of many the rooms that were not being utilized or utilized properly during covid. Mary has a solid grasp on anything going on in or through the church and is an incredible asset to our team and a great resource of information if you have any questions. Make sure to let Mary know how much you appreciate everything she does as well.

We don't generally acknowledge the church board in the maintenance and personnel report, but thankfully for the past few years, serving on the church board required a minimal time commitment. Searching and placing a new senior pastor who will move Crossroads forward while honoring our past has been an enormous undertaking already. A huge thank you David Birkland, Mary Campbell, Cathy Crane, Art Kun, and Diana Wooden for their time and commitment to seeking God's best for Crossroads.

I also want to acknowledge that we are currently still without an official music director. Every volunteer involved in music ministry has really risen to the challenge. Thank you to each of you for stepping up and working so beautifully together to lead our congregation in praise and worship each week.

Finally, there are many, MANY amazing people in our congregation who generously and selflessly give of themselves. As Paul talks about in 1 Corinthians 12 - a body has many parts, but all its many parts form one body. You each deserve to be acknowledged by name but I'll run out of assigned space long before I could possibly finish. Please know, that we see you and appreciate you. More importantly, God sees.

As far as the building maintenance part of this report - prior to covid, we had hoped to renovate the main office. We did manage to relocate some of the items being stored in the main office but have continued to postpone this project until the finances hopefully stabilize a bit more. Our insurer did originally extend the deadline to deal with highlighted concerns, but we were required to deal with re-shingling the sloped portion of the roof. That project was completed over the summer and in time for the insurance companies' deadline. We were also concerned that the water from the downspouts wasn't draining away from the building properly. There were a number of suggestions about how to best deal with the problems but we ended up adding extensions higher up on the downspouts which so far seem to have made a huge improvement. This coming year we plan to repair some of the broken concrete around the exterior of the building. If you notice any concerns regarding building maintenance, please bring them to the attention of Marivic, Chelsey or Henry.



Our Church USHERS – have stepped up in an increasingly important role during the pandemic. Not only are they welcoming church family and guests, they're ensuring that safety measures are followed so the faithful can continue to worship.

As churches began to reopen for public worship after closing due to COVID-19, the role of ushers has changed. The task seemed almost impossible. There were so many regulations that needed to be met to have people safely worshipping. There were many more tasks to consider.

As USHERS we need to:

- Remind everyone entering the church building to wear a mask to prevent spread of the virus. To provide a face mask for those who come without one. And remind our congregation to wear mask at all times.
- Offer hand sanitizer to ensure that church family sanitize their hands before entering the sanctuary to worship and remind people to hand sanitize after the service.
- They help guide the people into the worship space or stand ready to take guests to their seats if needed.
- Stand by the door as soon as the service is done and hold the offering plate to help people where they could put their tithing gifts.
- See to it that there isn't a crowd at the doorway or lobby.
- Open the doors widely as people leave so visitors don't have to touch the doors.

Our church services are no longer the same as it were before the pandemic.

We did find ways to let our congregation know that we are here for them. From 2020 to 2021 I had probably tried and used about 10 different computer programs and turned to various online options. Randy, Chelsey and I are continually experimenting with ways on how to better reach our church family and share the services with those families that prefer to join us in their own living rooms because of potential health risk by being physically present in church.

So after scrambling to go virtual in the early days of the pandemic, the experience is now more far-reaching. Crossroads is currently drawing more attendance online than we typically do in person. The average attendance online ranges from 170 to 300 plus each Sunday. Isn't God amazing! In this pandemic and global chaos, only God could turn this tragedy for good by reaching more souls for His glory!

"What the enemy intends for evil, God will use for good."

Through it all, like most other churches we learned to build our virtual community. By using different social media platforms and going LIVE each Sunday we are no longer constrained in the four walls of our church. We now have the technology to reach and evangelize people not only in

our community but God is continuously opening doors for us to touch lives of people globaly who log-in to our Facebook, YouTube and website accounts to hear the gospel of Christ every Sunday.


We also want to thank you. Because of your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service and commitment we were able to rise above the circumstances that each of us have to face emotionally, physically and spiritually during this difficult time. We did work as one family here at Crossroads and that's what inspired us to look for ways that we can be connective and be able to work together as a body of Christ. With these new technologies before us, with free learning opportunities and resources we were able to reach our church goers to use these new digital tools of evangelism.

Thanks to Randy for doing a great job by bringing our Church Service Live every Sunday into your homes using the "ATEM MiniPro". The switcher makes live streaming easier by providing easy ways to switch camera views, and facilitates data transfer to Facebook for the livestream. Randy also monitors the live sound and a second mix for the livestream off our sound board. Both Randy and Chelsey are doing the best they can to make it work. And we do ask for your prayers that things will always run smoothly every Sunday. And if you miss it at 10:30am you can watch it in the afternoon or later during the week. Chelsey and I are also posting the Church Service online on YouTube and our website.

LEDSIGN UPDATE

Like any other computerized equipment our sign is getting old and we had some issues with it last December. After much communication and consultation from the Technical Support from Genoptic Smart Displays in Calgary, (the company that maintains our ledsign) their diagnostic was there was something wrong with the sensor and the circuit board inside the sign that the sensor connects to. In January we called in a licensed electrician and hired a bucket truck. Fortunately, they were able to fix it but we were advised to make the necessary upgrades in the near future. We need to eventually replace the sensor or the entire board for the sensor. A sensor is around \$100, but the board is \$650 to keep it in good running condition. We will keep you all posted. POWERPOINT



The end of November, Pastor Ches and I retired from 29 years of ministry. We are so grateful for the privilege of serving our




church and community. We really have no plans at this time and will serve wherever the Lord leads us. We are happy to lend a hand whenever needed.

WOMEN'S MINISTRIES REPORT - 2021 Greetings Crossroads family.






Children's Ministry



Children's Ministries continues to encompass three groups each Sunday morning. We have a nursery for children aged newborn through three years old. Children's church is for children aged four through eight, and junior youth is for children aged nine through fourteen.

At the beginning of 2021, churches were limited to a maximum of 30 people for in person worship so children's church remained virtual. For the first two months of the year, I purchased a resource called "Eat This Book" which was a fun and colorful booklet containing a number of challenges to help kids dig in to their bibles. I offered monthly prizes as additional incentive to participate. Parents also received weekly emails containing suggestions as to how they could point to Jesus throughout their day. I also continued adding new suggested content each week to our Children's Ministry library on Right Now Media.



In March, I sent home comprehensive lessons designed to be utilized as a family. In May, I again visited each family and delivered a Mother's Day craft to the kids. I also took photos of each of the kids displaying their favorite thing about their mom and offered a few additional family photos if they desired. We shared the photo slideshow with the church on Mother's Day. In June we distributed family bible studies

and I also emailed a short helpful parenting video for caregivers of both younger children and teenagers on a weekly basis. In September, after eighteen months apart - we were finally able to resume in person Children's Ministries. I do try to check in with our families who have not returned just yet, but focus the majority of my effort on preparing for our weekly gatherings. In the children's church classroom, we have resumed using our curriculum from Group called Dig In – Epic Teachings of the Bible. We've covered learning about each of the pieces of the Armour of God, and are currently working our way through the sermon on the mount.

Covid has really placed a spotlight on the importance of not just children's ministry, but family ministry. In ideal situations, the church gets an average of forty hours per year to influence the children who walk through our doors. Parents get an average of three thousand hours in the same year to influence their children. These last two vears in particular have been less than ideal and today's parents are busier than ever and generally unsure how to intentionally point their kids to Jesus. It's important we equip families to incorporate faith discussions into our day to day lives. Deuteronomy 6:6-7 (NIV) tells us, "These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. 7 Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." God's intention is for parents to be the primary faith influencer and the church to come alongside in community. As we look forward and plan for the future, it has quickly become our priority to not just nurture and minister to the children who walk through our doors but to really invest in the entire family. Having parents model a healthy faith and reliance on Jesus is far more effective in discipling a child than the best curriculum money could ever buy. I encourage each of you to please go over our church directory and pray for these young families on a regular basis. Make sure to reach out and let them know you're cheering for them and ready to help.



Nursery has gotten a lot quieter as many of the kids who were using the room have been promoted to and faithfully attend children's church. Prior to covid, the nursery averaged attendance of six children or less per week. Since re-opening nursery ministry, we occasionally have one or two. There are many volunteers who are also not attending regularly which makes scheduling quite a challenge. A huge thank you to Debbie Johnson who has volunteered in the nursery faithfully almost every week since September. We are grateful for many of the youth in the church who happily volunteer to assist in the nursery on busier days as well (which is how we operated prior to covid). I am extremely grateful to each of my children's ministry volunteers who are quick to step up when tapped on the shoulder each week. It would definitely help save me a few grey hairs if I had a few

more volunteers for a regular rotation or even a few who would consider volunteering on a substitute basis only. If you want to make a difference in the world, make a difference in the life of a child. Please consider volunteering in children's ministries.



With the ever-evolving mandates, we opted not to offer Vacation Bible School in 2021 as well. Molly and I had the privilege of attending a children's ministries conference shortly before covid and our keynote speaker was Josh Denhart. He's the author and creator of many children's ministries resources but most notably he's produced a number of science based VBS kits. Kids will have an amazing time doing some incredible hands-on learning. I had purchased one of the VBS kits for this summer 2020 so we're excited to utilize it in 2022. If you'd like an opportunity to be involved in a fantastic outreach event, then come speak to me about the many ways you can contribute. Maybe working with kids is too overwhelming for you, but decorating or preparing crafts or shopping is what you



love to do? There's lots of ways to get involved – you won't be sorry you did!








The board has continued to re-evaluate at different points throughout the last two years whether it was safe to resume meeting, but the reality is that KidZone and Jr. Youth bring together children from almost every school in the city which made it a very high-risk situation. KidZone is a fantastic extra curricular activity for children aged 4 through 8. We plan to resume meeting on Wednesday evenings from 6:45pm to 8pm in September 2022. We spend time playing in the gym, we focus on one new praise and worship song each month and we have a lot of fun learning about our heavenly father and how to apply the wisdom of the Bible to our lives. Best of all - it's free! Kids this age are a critical mission field. Statistics continue to show that more than 80% of people commit their lives to Jesus between the ages of 4 and 14. However, we previously thought that there were an exodus of our youth leaving the church after graduating high school. The newest statistics show we are actually losing them much earlier than that. Make no mistake, there is a war for these kid's souls and we need to invest in them and help them develop a solid biblical foundation and defense for their faith. Encourage any parents you know to mark it on their calendars for fall 2022 and bring their children in to try it out. We are looking for some additional volunteers to help on Wednesday evenings as well. I assure you - you ARE qualified. If you may be able to assist even occasionally, please see Chelsey for additional details. Your support and prayers for this outreach ministry are greatly appreciated.

In the absence of mid-week ministries, we have focused our Sunday morning lessons on our junior youth. We are blessed to have Molly Johnson take the lead on that ministry. Since resuming in person teaching in

September of 2021, Molly has covered a series on friendship, the miracles of Jesus, a series on our sin nature and of course – a series on Christmas. In the new year, we've begun with a series that is a play off of a popular game called "Among Us". We look forward to investing in each of the junior youth entrusted to us and encouraging them to grow and really own their faith. If you have a youth aged 9 through 14, please be watching for upcoming announcements regarding mid- week ministries in the fall. We'd love to have them join us!

SR. Youth -


Senior Youth has actually experienced some growth through over the past year and we now generally average an attendance of around 20 youth each week. For the majority of 2021 we were able to continue meeting in person, although at times we opted to use the sanctuary instead of our youth room so we were able to provide adequate spacing.

Last year we began using curriculum published by "Ministry to Youth". They had created an annual plan that encouraged youth to KNOW (the foundations of their faith), GROW (become more like Jesus and grow in their faith) and GO (evangelism, sharing their faith and leading others by living out their faith). We really enjoyed the lessons. They were relevant and engaging and the flow worked well. When they offered a second fully planned year, we opted to continue utilizing the curriculum again this year. We also supplement with material from "Download Youth Ministry". They offer a wide range of digital products including curriculum and devotionals, but our favorites are the digital games. We also utilize a number of their social media graphics.

We continued meeting socially over the summer. We kicked off the summer mini golfing out at Fairview Fairways. In July we met at the Kinsmen Waterpark for a beautiful afternoon, finishing just before a summer storm threatened to close down the event. In August we got together and

shared pizza brought by one of the youth, and some ice cream sundaes before premiering the new Disney movie "Adventure Cruise". We finished the summer off by bowling together and sharing some pizza.

Senior Youth Group is for youth aged 14-19. We meet at the church on Friday nights, September through May. I am incredibly grateful for the support of Randy Watchman and Molly Johnson in leading youth group. Meals For New Moms

Meals for New Moms is a ministry of Cross-roads' to reach out to the people in our community. To welcome the new baby and mom home we deliver meals for two weeks and bless their families. Community Outreach



Our food pantry is motivated by our faith in Christ to serve our community by providing non-perishable food items to individuals or families in need. It is Crossroads way of responding to the immediate need to help and supply food within our church family and our community, a practical means of offering love and hope. We also make time to listen to their stories and show them that we care.

As a result of economic challenges this past year families in need in our community have continued to grow. Since 2021 we were able to help between four to six families per month. We usually give out one bag per family but also depending upon the number of family members per household.

Update from the TREASURER



I'd like to start by offering a huge thank you to all of you for your faithfulness and obedience in giving. Your faithful giving allows us to support ministries that have a global impact for Christ as well as ministering to our local community.

I've been the treasurer for Crossroads for almost 15 years now. I was blessed to assume the position while the church was in a solid and positive position. Despite a number of large challenges since then including a major roof repair and significant upgrades to the sanctuary lighting, the church has remained debt free for the entirety of the time I've done the bookkeeping. All glory goes to God for that amazing accomplishment and the generous contributions of time, talent and resources from our church family and surrounding community. Last year was a year of growing in faith and trusting God to supply just enough, and He did. Covid has shrunk our regular church attendance fairly significantly but also expanded our digital reach. Financially 2020 to 2021, our donations stayed fairly steady. We continued diligently monitoring spending and this year are beyond grateful to announce that we finished the year with a net income of approximately \$6700. And that included having the roof re-shingled and purchasing a higher-powered computer for the soundroom. As we prepare for 2022, there are a number of unknowns and extras that have us setting the bar a little higher again this year. We pray and continue to trust that God knows our need and will continue to supply through the faithfulness of His people.

Prior to covid, Crossroads had already started adding electronic giving options. First, we added "Tithely" to process credit card donations. Tithely is a digital platform that can be logged into over the internet from your home computer, or you can use it via an app that is available for iPhone and Android. When you open the application

or website for the first time, you'll be prompted to create an account using your contact information, as well as an email address. When you've confirmed your account, you'll be able to link a credit card to your account. From the home page, you'll search for Crossroads Pentecostal Assembly. Once you've selected our church, you'll be able to specify the amount and where you would like the funds designated. There are options available if you'd like to cover the cost of the credit card processing fees, and you also have an option to setup automated giving using your credit card. The credit card processing fee is 2.9% + 0.30/transaction. If you choose to cover the cost of the credit card processing fees, you will also be receipted for that amount.



Then we added the option to do pre-authorized debits. This service allows donors to automate their giving through pre-authorized withdrawals from your bank account. Providing this option to our congregation was a little pricier up front, but becomes more cost effective as more people utilize it. There are forms available in the office or via email for those who are interested in automated giving. When you fill in the form, you'll select the amount you'd like to give and your withdrawal date. Crossroads recognizes the benefits of automated giving. Automated giving allows us to budget more accurately and smooths out traditional dips in finances due to the inability to attend church in person. It also allows the donor to set a giving goal and meet it without any challenges.

Finally last year we also added the ability to accept e-mail money transfers. This has been by far our most utilized form of giving over the course of the last year. Email money transfers can be sent to:

We are registered for auto-deposit so most donors will not be required to set up a password by their bank. If you have any other questions about any of these options, I'd be happy to answer them for you.

A friendly reminder that even when utilizing electronic giving options, designating your funds is available and encouraged and we are diligent in sending your funds where you request they be sent.



The general designation is to be used for your general tithing and offerings. Other designations include missions, building projects, women's ministries, King's Kids, or youth. We are also able to forward funds to Teen Challenge, Horizon College & Seminary, Living Waters Camp, ERDO, Watoto Children's Choir, Yorkton Dream Centre and our local Christian radio channel. In Tithely, there is a drop-down menu available to designate your offerings. The default selection is set to "tithe". You can select designations when initially setting up your pre-authorized debits, and you can designate funds when e-transferring by utilizing the memo field. Undesignated funds are added to the general fund.

I'm at the church on Tuesday and Thursday mornings and I am more than happy to answer any questions you may have on my personal phone number as well. It's a pleasure being involved in our church team and may God bless each of you.
