The new Community Garden at Belling Street is under way with five beds now planted with an assortment of vegetables.

Community gardens are places where people come together to grow fresh food, to learn, relax and make new friends.



This one is a community owned and run garden that anyone can access at any time. At this stage there isn't even a committee (although that may be desirable in the future) so its very free and easy and user friendly.

A handful of people have been getting their hands dirty, popping in seedlings and seeds as well as watering them in and giving them a bit of protection from the elements so you can go around anytime and have a potter- planting etc, especially if you would like to enjoy the results in a few months time!

It's easy and satisfying "work" at the raised beds and with almost everything on hand that is needed. Just take hand tools and a watering can if you have them, and the desire to enjoy an hour in the fresh air. You can also take seeds or plants that you'd like to find a spot for - much better to share the work and resources than trying to do it all yourself, at home :)

This year's Brinkworth Country Fair was part of a massive day for the town on April 9th.

Held simultaneously, in perfect weather, at Stockyard Reserve and the Primary School respectively, the Fair and the Battle of Brinkworth lawnmower races attracted about 800 fun-loving people of all ages who were able to commute between venues on a shuttle bus.

The short stay RV park and environs at Stockyard Reserve - an area under the management of Fair organisers, Brinkworth Progress Association - provided a shaded "food court" for people to sit and eat while enjoying free entertainment by Lee Brock's Outback Overdrive band or the ever-popular James' Travelling Magic Show. Colourful food, drink and variety stalls around the area and under the shady trees next to the children's playground created a festive atmosphere and kept everyone entertained, fed and hydrated while raising funds for local organizations and businesses.

Sleek and elegant classic cars from clubs at Port Pirie and Morgan and a display of working stationary engines attracted much attention as well.

Brinkworth resident Helen Tate said her grandkids aged 7 and 9 enjoyed the Fair, especially the magic show. "Us grandparents enjoyed sitting down at a table in the shade with a cuppa and a yummy CWA cake, listening to the great live music by Outback Overdrive", she said.

"The lawnmower race was another fun event on the day," she said, "with the thrills and spills of the Ride On Lawnmowers and delicious food. The grandkids loved it all."

Organisers are grateful for the support of Wakefield Regional Council, Mills Freightlines Pty Ltd, Brinkworth Recreation Ground committee and the Plains Producer.

The Fair will be on again next year at the same venue. See you there!

The 2022 Battle of Brinkworth ride-on lawnmower races, hosted by the Brinkworth Special Projects Group, was again held in the top paddock of the primary school oval.

The track was slightly modified from the previous year, principally by the addition of a wider starting grid and the incorporation of a sweeping bend into the main straight. Although depleted by Covid, the field of competition was strong. A number of classifications, ranging from competitive juniors to the Super Modified 450cc class, each battled through several rounds of races. Thrills and spills were the order of the day and no significant injuries were incurred. An inaugural 'hot lap' competition was held, the winner presented with the largest of the hand built trophies for the day.

All food and drink stalls were run by community groups and small local businesses. A licensed bar was organised by the bowling club. If the dust, noise and crowds got too much, a boot sale and impromptu classic car display nestled in the cool shade of some pine trees. From the gate you could catch a lift to the nearby Country Fair on the community bus.

The sponsor's raffle was won by Billy (aged five) who received his much desired scale model truck and tractor. The wood raffle prizes were won by Roy Tate and Barry Strawbridge.
