PE Docent Information



What is a PE Docent?

A PE docent is a volunteer who organizes and conducts physical education activities to a group of students, with teacher supervision. Coyote Ridge Elementary School/Dry Creek District utilizes the SPARKS curriculum, filled with a variety of PE activities. The SPARKS curriculum will be used to guide the PE program & is easy for any parent to implement! There are two different levels: K-2nd and 3rd-6th grades. There are numerous pieces of PE equipment available to use for teaching lessons.





How much time will it take?

Generally, classroom teachers will ask a PE docent to lead a lesson either once a month or even up to once a week. Each PE lesson is usually 30-45 minutes. The number of days/amount of time is decided by the classroom teacher.





What is the responsibility of the classroom teacher?

Teachers/PE teachers should help guide a docent as to what lesson/unit is to be taught.
