SUBJECT: **PARTICIPATION TO THE 7th NORTHEASTERN LUZON REGION  
SCOUT JAMBOREE**

1. We are pleased to announce the holding of the 7<sup>th</sup> Northeastern Luzon Region Scout Jamboree on 7-11 March 2018 at Camp Agbaper, Masoc, Bayombong Nueva Vizcaya with the theme, Commitment to Excellence."

2. **Aims & Objectives.**

The jamboree aims to provide an environment of learning, safe and enjoyable to enhance their physical, social, mental, emotional and spiritual potentials. By the end of the jamboree the scouts would be able to:

- 2.a promote regional solidarity and understanding
- 2.b. undertake community service activities through the community immersion projects through the World Scout Environment Education Program (WSEEP); appreciation of nature through the Scouts-Go-Solar, and promotion of peace among their fellow scouts and their leaders and the community through the Messenger of Peace initiatives.
- 2.c undergo activities that will enable them to complete requirements of selected merit badges of both Boy Scout and Senior Scout advancement like first aid, emergency preparedness, and life saving.
- 2.d Develop skills and capacities through team buildings activities, games, vocational activities, group dynamics, creativity, character building and critical thinking through problem solving.

3. **Qualification:**

3.a **Scout**

- registered Boy Scouts or Senior Scouts
- must be at least nine (9) years old to twelve (12) years for boy scouts & twelve (12) years old to seventeen (17) years old for Senior Scouts.
- must have adequate camping experiences and physically fit to undergo vigorous activities and must have parent's consent.

### 3.b **Adult Leaders**

- registered Unit Leader for at least two years and have adequate camping experience
- physically fit as certified by a physician and of good moral character

### 3.c **Regional Service Team**

The Regional Office in collaboration with the Council Scout Executives of the Northeastern Luzon Region will accept Regional Service Team, however interested applicants shall see the Council Scout Executives of the councils which the module shall be assigned:

## 4. Registration Details

### 4.a **Registration Fee**

A registration fee of Five Hundred Pesos (Php 500.00) shall be charged each participant to defray administrative costs, program materials, souvenir items (bag, t-shirt, ID w/ lace, certificates) and other operating expenses.

### 4.b **Registration Guidelines**

In order to provide the host council, Nueva Vizcaya Council the much needed logistical and administrative preparation, a reservation fee of One Hundred Pesos (Php 100.00) shall be deposited to the account of the Nueva Vizcaya Council on or before 28 February which will serve as seed money for the jamboree. This also will determine the strength of the participation and to give ample time for the preparation of program materials, souvenir items and other administrative concern.

Should there be additional registration after the deadline of the payment of registration, they would be treated the least priority on all issuances but can attend the activities/modules of the jamboree.



**4.c Participation Ratio:**

A minimum ratio of 1 adult leader in every eight boys shall be observed. This is to minimize the number of adults in the camp and providing the scouts the opportunity to prepare their own meals and orderliness in the camp.

**5. Travel Itinerary**

All jamboree contingents must be settled in the camp not later than 1200hrs, 7 March 2018 and will only be allowed to leave the camp after the Grand Closing Ceremonies and issuance of Camp Clearance.

**6. Food & other Jamboree Provisions**

The District Contingent shall make sure that the food provision and other basic requirements shall be adequate for the duration of the jamboree. Wet and dry markets will be available in the camp.

For light & water provisions, all district contingents shall bring their own water containers (big) and wire/extensions. Source or power will only be installed in strategic locations.

**7. Scouts Uniforms & Transportation**

All scouts who join the jamboree will bring their type A and B scouts uniform with the scout neckerchief. The Two (2) jeepneys sponsored by PLGU will be stationed at the Division office on 7 March 2018 at 9:00 AM to ferry scouters in a first come first serve basis. Participants who will not be accommodated will travel on their own expense.

8. All District Scouts Coordinators/members of the Local Council Executive Board are enjoined to assist scouters in their respective districts. They should also be responsible for the official release of their delegation from their respective district.

**9. Other Information**

- Each Senior Scout must bring 2 pcs of spar (arnis) (preferably rattan, 1 meter long (for module 2)
- Each Boy Scout must bring one pet bottle (1.5 liter or 2 liters), one old Glossy magazines and old news paper
- Contingents must bring their own sacks/plastic bags for their own trash which will be hauled by the municipal bio-man.
- Drop off line for electricity will be provided. Contingent shall bring their own electric lines.
- Bring big water container as fire trucks will be rationing water in the camp.

11. Scout Pageant

Each council shall have one entry for the scout pageant. The registration is Php 500.00. To determine the winner, 50 % shall be taken from the Wit and Talent portion while 50% shall be taken from the cash vote.

Criteria:

1. Most Articulate – 20%
2. Best in Scout Uniform – 10%
3. Best in Indegineous Attire- 10%
4. Talent - 10%

12. We will also include search for the Best Camp Gate, Best Camp Lay-out, Best in Gadgetry, Biggest Delegation [(except for the host) computed against total membership of December 2017] and Cleanest Camp.
