

<u>Italian Heritage</u> Best Hidden Gems in Italy

Gubbio [gubbjo]) is in Umbria region, twenty-five miles northeast of Perugia and about 40 miles south of Urbino in the neighboring Marche region. The town is beautifully set on the lower slopes of Mt. Ingino. Gubbio is one of the most ancient towns in Umbria, remaining marvelously well-preserved over the centuries, with many monuments that bear witness to its glorious past. The town is one of the best preserved medieval towns in Italy Architecturally it represents the zenith

of medieval civilization. Gubbio's compact town center has a good selection of mediaeval, Gothic and Renaissance structures built of gray limestone and has great views over the beautiful countryside.

> The Eugubine Tablets (also know as Iguvine Tablets) are series seven bronze tablets with writing in the Umbrian language, preserved at the Civic Museum in Palazzo dei Consoli. The tablets discovered in 1441 near Eugubium, in Italy, containing inscriptions which supply a key to the original tongues of Italy prior to Latin.

> The tablets contain religious inscriptions that memorialize the acts and rites of the Atiedian Brethren, a group of 12 priests of Jupiter with important

municipal functions at Iguvium.

Gubbio wealthy and politically important families during the Renaissance greatly contributed to the development of arts and crafts. At that time the fame of Gubbio pottery increased enormously, thanks to Mastro Giorgio's luster plates which are among the most relevant pieces of Italian Renaissance art. Over the centuries Gubbio ceramics have always kept their unique character and a strong attachment to traditional techniques that has granted them a solid group of fans among pottery lovers and collectors.

The Roman Theatre of Gubbio is its most visited attraction. It was built during the reign of Emperor Augustus. During that time, it was the second-largest in the Roman Empire and was the earliest Roman theatre built entirely upon two-story hollow substructures.

> The Palazzo dei Consoli is one of the most iconic medieval buildings in Gubbio, dating back to 1332 when it was built by Angelo da Orvieto. The palace is locat-

ed directly on the Piazza Grande, the main square in Gubbio. From here, you'll enjoy beautiful views over the medieval town and some of the distant Umbrian countryside. A visit to the Piazza is a definite must of all the things to do in Gubbio.

On top of Mount Ingino is the Roman Catholic Basilica of Sant'Ubaldo,

which was built in the early 1500s. Its name comes from Saint Ubaldo, the patron saint of Gubbio who lived in the 12th century. St. Ubaldo's sarcophagus is kept at the top of the Basilica's main altar on a marble plinth, surmounted by a glass case. The best way to get to the Basilica is by taking a one-person funicular or Funivia Colle Eletto. This is no ordinary funicular, as it is open air and can only fit two people at a time while standing up. It takes around 6 minutes to get to the top of Mount Ingino. On the way up you can see all of Gubbio and its ancient Roman walls.

> If you didn't already know, Umbria is the heart of Italy's truffle industry, producing the largest quantities of black truffles. Gubbio happens to be known for their superb quality white truffles. In Italy it is called Tartufo an Italian dessert. They have an incomparable aroma and flavor.
