

WHY JESUS CAME






GOD'S PROPHECY

GOD'S PROPHECY



The seed of satan or the devil, which is <u>sin and death</u>. (See James 1: 14-15). We know Jesus ultimate assignment was to destroy the eternal effect of sin by defeating sin and death. He defeated sin by living a sinless life and He defeated death by resurrecting from the dead. This prophecy explains how Jesus would gain victory over satan by crushing his head and that satan would bruise Jesus heel. We know that the crushed head is deadly, which symbolizes satan's defeat.

King Herod plot to kill Jesus.



JESUS DEATH AND RESURRECTION


