KNOW THE RULES

9.5 PASSING DISTANCES 9.5.1 Short Pass (i) When a player passes the ball there must be sufficient space for an opposing player on the court to be able to intercept the ball as it moves from the hands of the thrower to those of the receiver. Sanction: Free pass (ii) If two players from the same team gain possession of the ball in quick succession, the second player's hands must be removed, or it will be deemed to be a short pass. Sanction: Free pass (iii) If two opposing players gain possession of the ball in quick succession, the umpire calls 'possession', indicates the player who caught the ball <u>first and allows play to continue</u>.

WING ATTACK (WA)

Speed, smart, selflessness, creativity, quick hands, ability, balance and control – these are the characteristics of a good wing attack, whose role it is to constantly set up play through passing and positioning, as well as setting the game's tempo.

A wing attack is usually the key feeder of the ball into the goal shooters. They are adept at taking the centre pass, aware of the location of other players at all times — including around the goal circle edge — and able to transition the ball from defence to attack.

A wing attack also needs to be master of the short and the sharp; they need to execute a variety of moves and passes and be skilled at shutting down the wing defence in driving the ball from defence to attack.
