Bring your receipt for the embroidery to the Treasurer and the club will refund \$5.00 towards the cost.


Grey Club Polo Shirts:

FORD BRIQUETTES—an interesting item from Bob Trevan

The automotive titan, Henry Ford, once used his innovative effort to produce the FORD charcoal briquette for the American BBQ lovers. With the enormous amount of left over wood from production of his Model T' production (just being burnt), FORD soon developed a hydraulic press to produce square briquettes that became a household item in USA until about 1927—or whilst Ford was still using a lot of wood in it's construction.

Ford Motor Company manufactured charcoal from wood scraps produced by its lumber operations in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. The scraps were burned, mixed with starch and compressed into compact briquettes. Ford sold the charcoal to the public through its network of auto dealerships, as well as through conventional hardware, sporting goods and department stores. It was a prominent example of Henry Ford's commitment to reducing and reusing waste.
