About the site: The female homeless veteran's house is located in a beautiful historical home that houses up to eleven female veterans. The grassroots effort to establish a veteran's home for women began in 2008 and was quickly adopted by many service groups and individuals as a project to become part of; as a result, over \$500,000 was raised through donations and grants.

Heritage Home for Women

Address: 1519 Union Street, Schenectady, NY 12309

About the site: In 1868, Schenectady residents recognized the need for a caring environment for older women and formed an organization, known as the "Haven of Rest." The original location of the residence was on Green Street, in the Stockade. In 1905, the present home at 1519 Union Street was opened to accommodate 43 women and a round-the-clock staff. In 1968, the name was changed to "Heritage Home for Women." The Heritage Home for Women is a unique adult care living experience: independent living for those who prefer not to live alone and assistance with personal care for those who need that help. **See:** <http://heritagehome4women.net>

The goal of Jack's Place is to provide a "home" for the families of out of town patients of Ellis Medicine and Sunnyview Rehabilitation Hospital while their loved ones are rehabilitating. Eight families can be accommodated in Jack's Place which opened in June, 2017.

The Joan Nicole Prince Home, which is located in a residential neighborhood in Scotia, provides 24-hour bedside care for two residents at a time who have a prognosis of three months or less. The home is primarily staffed by volunteers and relies on community support for funding.

Umbrella of the Capital District

“Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy”

About the site: Umbrella of the Capital District now serves over 500 homes in Albany, Schenectady, Saratoga and Rensselaer counties in upstate New York. It is a membership organization. For an annual fee, Umbrella members have access to a screened, skilled group of handy persons who provide a variety of services, including home repairs, housekeeping, lawn and gardening and shopping for a fixed hourly rate, currently \$15/hr. The majority of Umbrella's handy persons are themselves retirees. They empathize with the homeowners and build a relationship of trust and mutual respect that often lasts for as long as members stay in the program. In addition to home maintenance, Umbrella provides access to vetted contractors for plumbing, electrical and other jobs beyond the scope of retired handy persons. It also operates an around-the-clock emergency line for heat and other emergencies. Members who need assistance that Umbrella can't provide, like personal care, often receive help in locating the services they need through Umbrella's experienced staff. <https://theumbrella.org>
