What was planned. What happened. What now.

Last spring, Kenyan Pastor Nelson Ojowi contacted Pastor Art Dyer of Grace Covenant Church, Columbia, Missouri, asking him to come to help stabilize the network of 15 churches he oversees in rural Kenya and Tanzania.

The membership of Grace Covenant agreed that Pastor Art should respond to this request by gathering a team and go as soon as feasible.

Pastor Art, his wife, Linda, Elder David Briscoe, and Brad Licklider, a retired nurse and Grace Covenant board member, left March 17th to fly to Nairobi and on to Migori.

What was planned

Pastor Nelson had arranged an itinerary that included 4 days of tent meetings, a 2day pastors' conference, baptisms and tours of the churches' various ongoing projects. The team also planned to spend a couple of days touring the Masai Maara game preserve and visiting Lake Victoria.

What actually happened

We did everything on Pastor Nelson's itinerary and then some! Because the crowds grew larger day by day, the decision was made to extend the meetings an extra day. Attendance swelled to an estimated 400-500 at the

highest point, with people standing 5 to 6 deep on all sides of the tent.

The worship services were filled with lively and enthusiastic praise music that set the mood for the preaching of the Word of God. Each message was translated from English to Swahili to Luo, the local language.

In response to the preaching, a total of 15 people came to faith in Jesus for salvation during the tent meetings and the following week; 36 were baptized in the nearby river.

Men, women and children received prayer and many were healed.and delivered.

The team also conducted a pastors' seminar and made two nearby home visita-tions.
